A Legislative Resolution Titled:

“A RESOLUTION OF THE CROW TRIBAL LEGISLATURE TO SUPPORT THE MITIGATION OF HEALTH DISPARITIES IN NATIVE AMERICAN YOUTH USING NUTRITIONAL INTERVENTION STUDY”

Legislative Findings:

WHEREAS, the Crow Tribal Legislature (hereinafter “Legislature”) has the power and duty under Article V, Section 2 of the Crow Tribal Constitution to promulgate and adopt resolutions in accordance with the Constitution and federal laws for the governance of the Crow Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Crow Tribal Legislature supports the “Mitigation of Health Disparities in Native American Youth using Nutritional Intervention Project” through MSU-Bozeman, for Native American in schools in Montana; and

WHEREAS, The science teachers, principals and School Boards of schools serving the Crow reservation have expressed interest in seeing if student school performance can be improved with nutritional supplements; and

WHEREAS, the study is aimed at determining if added nutrients can help improve student learning in school and therefore better prepare them for life after school and for finding and keeping jobs. Students will also learn how to get more of the most important nutrients by food choices, and by returning closer to traditional diets, which should help to avoid health problems; the nutritional supplements are a vitamin and mineral combination and an omega-3 fat, DHA (docosahexaeneoic acid), that is very important for the best brain function.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CROW TRIBAL LEGISLATURE IN REGULAR SESSION:

This Legislative Resolution take effect immediately upon becoming duly adopted by the Legislature. Attached with this Legislative Resolution, is Exhibit A “Mitigation of Health Disparities in Native American Youth using Nutritional Intervention Study”, Parent Consent Form and Data Sharing and Use agreement.
