JULY 2002 CROW TRIBAL LEGISLATURE

INTRODUCED BY: Blaine Bulltail, Executive Branch

BY REQUEST OF THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH OF THE CROW TRIBE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT REPEALING THE EXISTING TITLE 6
OF THE CROW TRIBAL LAW AND ORDER CODE AND ESTABLSHING TITLE
8A OF THE CROW TRIBAL LAW AND ORDER CODE."

WHEREAS, the existing Title 6 of the Crow Tribal Law and Order Code, which governs criminal procedure in the Crow Tribal Courts, does not comply with new standards and internal citation references of Title 8B of the Crow Tribal Criminal Code, and

WHEREAS, Title 8B of the Crow Law and Order Code governs Criminal Offenses and was previously adopted as governing law; however, Title8A, governing criminal procedures, was not adopted along with Title 8B as governing law; and

WHEREAS, Title 8A must now be adopted to comply with Title 8B so as Criminal Procedures and Criminal Offenses will be governed according to new and compliant standards within the Crow Law and Order Code.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE CROW TRIBE:

REPEAL. Section 1. Upon adoption of this Bill, the existing Title 6 of the Crow Tribal Law and Order Code is hereby repealed. (1) The existing Title 6 of the Crow Tribal Law and Order Code, upon adoption of this Bill by the Crow Tribal Legislative Branch, is hereby adopted in its entirety and shall no longer govern the Crow Tribe.

ADOPTION. Section 1. Upon adoption of the Bill, the proposed Title 8A of the Crow Tribal Law and Order Code is hereby adopted. (1) The proposed Title 8A of the Crow Tribal Law and Order Code, upon adoption of this Bill by the Crow Tribal Legislative Branch, is hereby adopted in its entirety and shall govern the Crow Tribal regarding Criminal Procedure in the Crow tribal Courts.

<u>CODIFICATION</u>. Section 1. Codification instruction. This Bill, upon adoption by the Crow Tribal Legislature, is intended to be Codified as Title 8A of the Crow Tribal Law and Order Code.

The following amendments were offered by Chief Judge Jim Ruegamer and confirmed by the Crow Tribal Legislature.

Criminal Code

Delete the following:

8A-3-101 (5) An affidavit of probable cause shall accompany the complaint, and be supported by such additional evidence as the Crow Tribal Judge may demand.

Amended:

(8) The Crow Tribal Judge shall hold a hearing if demanded by Defendant within 72 hours of arraignment; to determine whether probable cause as to the crime exists, and whether the appropriate defendant is named in the complaint.

Chapter 5 Arraignment and release

8A-5-101 Arraignment

(1) Arraignment is the bringing of an accused before the Crow Tribal Court whenever a complaint has been filed by the Crow Tribal prosecutor. Arraignment shall be held in open court without unnecessary delay after the accused is taken into custody and in no instance shall arraignment be later than 72 hours after incarceration.
