BY REQUEST OF THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH OF THE CROW TRIBE

A JOINT ACTION RESOLUTION FOR THE ENDORSEMENT BY THE CROW TRIBE OF SUPPLEMENTAL ENVIRONMENTAL PROJECTS PROPOSED BY CONOCO OIL COMPANY TO REDUCE FINANCIAL PENALTY PAYMENTS TO THE UNTIED STATES TREASURY RESOLUTION FOR THE 1998 CONOCO PIPELINE SPILL.

WHEREAS, in 1998, the Conoco Pipeline, which crosses the Crow Reservation, ruptured and caused a contaminating oil spill on the Crow reservation; and

WHEREAS, the Crow Tribe filed a lawsuit against the Conoco Oil Company in the Crow Tribal Court that was settled by the renegotiation of a new right way for the Conoco Pipeline in a total amount of \$58,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Justice commenced an enforcement action against the Conoco Oil Company under the National Environmental Protection Act that resulted in substantial financial penalties for the Conoco Oil Company; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Justice has agreed to allow the Conoco Oil Company to finance Supplemental Environmental Projects on the Crow Reservation to count as deductions of the financial penalty due to the United States Treasury; and

WHEREAS, the Crow Tribe will directly benefit from the proposed Supplemental Environmental Projects rather than for Conoco to pay the required penalty into the United States Treasury; and

WHEREAS, the Conoco Oil Company has identified the following four Supplemental Environmental Projects of the Crow Reservation:

- 1. Re-introduction of Yellowstone Cutthroat Trout into the lower 1.8 miles of Lost Creek near Pryor, Montana.
- 2. Proper abandonment of old community well in Wyola, Montana to prevent algae contamination of the Wyola water supply and to prevent injury to children and animals who may fall into the well.
- 3. Upgrade and repairs to the Pryor drinking water system to include construction of wellhead protection, investigation of the capacity of existing wells, renovate and rework the existing wells based on investigation, repair existing tank ladder and screen, and paint the storage thank interior.
- 4. Upgrade and repairs to other reservation communities as needed.

BE IT JOINTLY RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATIVE AND EXECUTIVE BRANCHES OF THE CROW TRIBE:

That the Legislative and Executive branches of the Crow Tribal Government hereby endorse the above described Supplemental Environmental Project proposed by Conoco, Inc. on the Crow Reservation and that the Crow Tribal Government will cooperate with Conoco, Inc. on the coordination and complection of the projects including any necessary public notice, exchange of relevant information and cooperation with retained contractors.
