JULY 2012 CROW TRIBAL LEGISLATURE JOINT ACTION RESOLUTION NO. JAR 12-05

INTRODUCED BY CEDRIC BLACK EAGLE, CHAIRMAN CROW TRIBAL EXECUTIVE BRANCH

JOINT ACTION RESOLUTION OF THE CROW TRIBAL LEGISLATURE AND THE CROW TRIBAL EXECUTIVE BRANCH ENTITLED:

"RESOLUTION APPROVING THE CROW TRIBE'S LIMITED WAIVER OF SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY IN THE PENDING MONTANA COAL BOARD GRANT FOR TRIBAL WATER TREATMENT PLANT IN CROW AGENCY."

WHEREAS, the Crow Tribe, on behalf of the Apsaalooke Water and Wastewater Authority, has submitted an application for a grant from the Montana Coal Board pursuant to Montana Code Annotated § 90-6-201, et seq., in the amount of \$46,250 to install a new chlorine injection room at the Tribal Water Treatment Plant in Crow Agency, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference (the "Coal Board Grant"); and

WHEREAS, a existing clorine injection room is badly in need of repairs or replacement in order to provide a safe and effectively functioning facility for adding chlorine to the water supply in Crow Agency; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Mont. Code Ann. § 90-6-209(2)(a), the Coal Board may not approve a grant to an Indian Tribe unless the Tribe has agreed:

- "(i) to waive its immunity from suit on any issue arising from the transaction of a grant obtained under this part; and
- "(ii) to the adjudication of any dispute arising out of the grant transaction in the district court of the first judicial district of the state of Montana[.]" and

WHEREAS, the Montana Coal Board will be considering the Crow Tribe's grant request at its quarterly meeting on July 20, 2012, and the Board staff have indicated that it would be helpful for the Tribe to have agreed to include the limited waiver of sovereign immunity and enforcement venue set forth above prior to the quarterly meeting; and

WHEREAS, the Chairman of the Executive Branch has authority and responsibility pursuant to the "enumerated powers" in Article IV, Section 3 of the Constitution and Bylaws of the Crow Tribe of Indians to represent the Crow Tribe in negotiations with Federal, State and local governments and other agencies, corporations, associations, or individuals in matters of welfare affecting the Crow Tribe, and to "negotiate and approve limited waivers of sovereign immunity when such a waiver is necessary for business purposes in accordance with Article V, Section 2(f) of [the] Constitution;" and

WHEREAS, the Legislative Branch has authority and responsibility pursuant to its "powers and duties" in Article V, Section 2(f) of the Constitution to "grant final approval or disapproval of limited waivers of sovereign immunity by the Executive Branch when waivers are necessary for business purposes;" and

WHEREAS, the receiving the funding provided by the Coal Board grant is in the best interests of the Crow Tribe, and the limited waiver of sovereign immunity required by Montana law is necessary for the business purpose of entering into the Coal Board grant agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CROW TRIBAL LEGISLATURE AND THE CROW TRIBAL EXECUTIVE BRANCH:

- Section 1. That the Crow Tribe agrees, as a condition of receiving the Coal Board Grant: (1) to grant a limited waiver of sovereign immunity from suit on any issue arising from the transaction of the above-described Coal Board grant; and (2) to the adjudication of any dispute arising out of the grant transaction in the district court of the first judicial district of the state of Montana.
- Section 2. That the Chairman of the Crow Tribal Executive Branch is hereby authorized to execute an agreement and any associated documents for the Coal Board Grant that contain the conditions set forth in Section 1 above, or substantially similar conditions in compliance with Mont. Code Ann. § 90-6-209.
- Section 3. That the approval granted herein is effective on the date of approval of this Resolution.


