A Legislative Resolution Titled:

A RESOLUTION OF THE CROW TRIBAL LEGISLATURE REPEALING LR 08-03; LR 09-09; AND, ESTABLISHING LEGISLATOR SEVERANCE BENEFIT PACKAGE

LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS:

WHEREAS, the Crow Tribal Legislature ("Legislature") has the power and duty under Article V, Section 2 of the 2001 Crow Constitution to promulgate and adopt resolutions in accordance with the 2001 Constitution and federal laws for the governance of the Crow Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature has reviewed and determined LR 08-03 and LR 09-09 to be vague law lacking appropriate language to implement a proper Legislator Severance Benefit Package "Severance"; and

WHEREAS, Legislators are not eligible for unemployment insurance based upon their status as "elected officials"; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature has determined the Severance should be recognized as a benefit, according to length of service and for a period enabling Legislators to obtain other income after their departure from the Legislature.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CROW TRIBAL LEGISLATURE IN SPECIAL SESSION:

The Legislature by this action does hereby repeal, LR 08-03, "An LR Rescinding LR-07-05 A Resolution Establishing A Program Wherein The Legislator's that do not Get Elected Have a Right to Receive Severance Pay at the Established Hourly Rate for a Period Of Up To 90 Days After Election"; and

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED:

The Legislature by this action does hereby repeal, LR 09-09, "Addition to the Legislative Branch Benefit Package"; and

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED:

The Legislature by this action does hereby establish a Legislator Severance Benefit Package as follows:

Section 1. Purpose

The purpose of Legislator Severance Benefit Package is to provide outgoing Legislators with a severance package to cover a reasonable amount of time of unemployment after their exit from the Legislature.

Section 2. Authority

In addition to the Legislator's due regular compensation, upon final check from the Legislature, severance compensation shall be issued to the Legislator or his/her beneficiary if the Legislator passes away while in office. Beneficiary form available through Legislative Branch Office.

Section 3. Declaration of Vacancy

Severance pay shall be allowed to a vacating Legislator as defined by the Constitution, Article VII-Vacancies, Section 2. Legislative Branch, except in circumstances of resignation.

Section 4. Illness/Death

Severance pay shall be allowed to Legislators leaving office due to illness or death.

Section 5. Misconduct.

A Legislator convicted of a felony committed/convicted while in office, or removed or recalled under the Constitution, Article VIII-Removal and Recall is not eligible to receive Severance. (Statute of limitations on placing a claim for Severance package by the former Legislator shall be twenty-four (24) months beginning the day the Legislator was acquitted.)

Section 6. Amount of Severance

Severance pay shall be equal to the current Senator base pay times the length of service following his/her last day in office on the following schedule:

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1 year
                    2 weeks pay
                    4 weeks pay
2 years
                    6 weeks pay
3 years
4 years
                    8 weeks pay
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BE IT HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED:

That this Resolution shall take effect immediately upon becoming duly adopted by the Legislature.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED:

That a certified copy of this Resolution shall be immediately delivered to the Tribal CPA by the Secretary of the Legislature.
